The International Day of Peace ("Peace Day") provides an opportunity for individuals, organizations and nations to create practical acts of peace on a shared date.

By creating the International Day of Peace, the UN devoted itself to worldwide peace and encouraged all of mankind to work in cooperation for this goal. The U.N. Resolution that established the International Day of Peace propose that:

“Peace Day should be devoted to commemorating and strengthening the ideals of peace both within and among all nations and peoples... This day will serve as a reminder to all peoples that our organisation, with all its limitations, is a living instrument in the service of peace and should serve all of us here within the organization as a constantly ringing bell reminding us that our permanent commitment, above all interests or differences of any kind, is to peace.”

Rt. Hon. Hilary Benn MP will discuss some of the most intractable challenges that directly or indirectly affect us such as poverty reduction and international development, peace and security, general and complete disarmament, protection of human rights and rule of law, a strong and credible United Nations.
